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RDG 3335 Reading Development in the Elementary School

Hybrid Course (online and face-to-face)

Course Description:

An understanding of reading development from emergent to fluency, methods of reading instruction, and sequence of instruction for the elementary classroom.

This course will be a Hybrid course—part on-line and part face-to-face. Access to on-line course materials will be through Blackboard (<http://blackboard.angelo.edu>).

Course Goal:

The major goal of this course is the training of preservice teachers who are:

- Knowledgeable about the basic reading skill of: emergent literacy, vocabulary, word identification, comprehension, and study skills as defined by TEKS and TAKS.
- Aware of and proficient in the use of a variety of strategies, procedures, and materials to teach these basic skills to all learners.
- Knowledge of the TExES Reading competencies (www.texas.ets.org).

Course Objectives:

Students will actively acquire knowledge and understand principles related to reading and will apply them for:

- Provide students with an overview of the reading process, which includes basic definitions, terminology, and theories of reading and philosophical positions.
- Acquaint students with the essential elements of reading as mandated by the state of Texas and identified by experts in the field (TExES)

- Provide students with knowledge of a variety of strategies and procedures for teaching reading.
- Locating and using appropriate resources for reading instruction.
- Encourage students to understand the uniqueness of each individual child and that appropriate instruction is based on the needs of the learner first and on the requirements of state and local mandates second.
