The Master of Education in Guidance and Counseling program is designed for those who are interested in pursuing a career as a public school counselor. Persons receiving this degree will be eligible to take the Texas Examination of Educator Standards (TExES) for the Professional Certificate for School Counselors.

Financial Assistance Availability

Angelo State University offers Carr Graduate Scholarships (requires GRE/GMAT test scores) for graduate students, which may help cover the cost of required tuition and fees. Scholarships may be awarded to qualified full- or part-time graduate students pursuing their first master's degree.
