## Practicum in Counseling EDG 6325 (formerly CI 6349) COURSE SYLLABUS Angelo State University Spring 2013

## **Course Description**

Three semester hours of supervised practical experience under the supervision of a certified school counselor. Curriculum and Instruction 6349 (160 clock hours) meets the requirements for the professional certificate in school counseling required by the Texas Education Agency.

Prerequisite: Permission of the graduate advisor.

The Texas Education Agency established new guidelines for practicum experiences effective December, 2010. Three observations by a field supervisor are now required. The practicum professor will visit only if problems or situations requiring intervention arise.

#### **Course Goals**

This course is dedicated to four goals:

- (1) gaining personal experience in a public school counseling setting,
- (2) demonstrating and documenting competency in the "Standards" for proficiency as a public school counselor,
- (3) preparing for the School Counselor TEXES examination, and
- (4) demonstrating effective interaction with / impact on learning of students. The Practicum in Counseling is based upon the "Standards for the School Counselor Certificate" established by the Texas Administrative Code, Title 19, Part 7, Chapter 239, Subchapter A, Rules 239.25 and the recommendations found in A Model Comprehensive, Developmental Guidance and Counseling Program for Texas Public Schools: A Guide for Program Development Pre-K-12th Grade, Revised 2004, Texas Education Agency,1701 North Congress Avenue, Austin, Texas 78701-1494, GE 350-1.

## **Graduate Student Learning Goals**

#### **Methods of Instruction**

A combination of supervised field experience and observations will be used to assist the student in acquiring the necessary skill and methods of practice as a school counselor. Course content will be linked to TExES standards related to school counseling as found at http://www.sbec.state.tx.us or in Blackboard at "Course Documents." Additionally the Texas Counseling Association Code of Ethics (found at http://www.txca.org) will be reviewed. Course Requirements Students are expected to complete all activities in order to successfully complete the course.

## **Course Requirements**

Candidates are expected to successfully complete all major course activities, and to electronically present these for grading as outlined by due dates listed in the Course Calendar below.

## **Major Course Activities**

All activities must be satisfactorily completed to receive course credit.

- 1. Classroom interaction field supervisor observations (3)
- 2. Classroom interaction lesson plans and reflection (3)
- 3. Counseling log (160 clock hours)
- 4. School mentor evaluation
- 5. Effects /Impact on student learning project
- 6. Classroom interaction
- 7. A major component of the practicum experience is to measure the impact on student learning. As part of the supervision process, you will be required to prepare and present THREE guidance lessons for evaluation by the field supervisor during the field visits.

Your lessons will be presented to students with the field supervisor observing. You will post your lesson plans on blackboard along with a reflection completed after the lesson.

Your reflection should include an evaluation of the impact of the responsive services element on student learning. Further information will be available on blackboard. 8. Effect on Student Learning project

9. Each practicum participant will identify a need on his/her campus. A plan to address the need will be formulated. A base line measure of the need will be established. The planned intervention will be conducted and a post intervention measure of the need will be provided. More information is available on blackboard. 10. Counseling log - 160 clock hours of practical experience, under the supervision of a certified public school counselor, are required for CI 6349. A log documenting these hours is a compulsory part of this course (sample log in Blackboard at "Course Documents"). The school mentor will verify the hours on a monthly basis. The school mentor will also complete the "Field

Supervisor Evaluation" survey e-mailed towards the end of the practicum.

11. School Mentor Evaluation The school counseling mentor will complete an online survey which will be e-mailed towards the end of the practicum experience.

#### **Course Evaluation Plan**

This course is graded on a pass/fail basis.

## **Grade Assignment Criteria**

Potential points – All assignments are graded on a Pass /Fail basis. Students will be given opportunity to correct any assignments not marked as Passed.
