FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is a transfer student?

ASU considers a transfer student to be someone who has 18 or more completed transferrable hours from an accredited institution. If a student has less than 18 completed transferrable hours, they will be considered a freshman transfer. This means that they will have to meet the requirements of an entering freshman, as well as the requirements of a transfer student. What grades transfer to ASU?

Grades of A, B, C, D, and F are computed as recorded on the transcript, and do transfer to ASU. Also, a grade of WF is averaged as F. Grades of W or WP are not used for admission or GPA purposes. The cumulative GPA at ASU will include all transfer work.

How many hours will transfer to ASU?

The Office of Transfer Student Services will enter all transferrable coursework; however, only 66 hours from a junior/community college will apply to the student's degree plan.

Do developmental courses transfer?

No. ASU will not accept technical, vocational, or remedial courses.

How long does it take to process my application?

The time it takes to process an application is dependent upon several factors. Usually once an application is submitted online; it can be entered within one to two weeks. If all of the required documents (i.e. transcripts, test scores, etc.) have been received, a decision can usually be made the day the last required document is received.

How many hours are needed to graduate from ASU?

Most degree plans require anywhere between 120-126 semester credit hours.
