



## **Faculty International Enrichment Program**

In order to promote interest, knowledge and participation of faculty in the importance of international study and research, the Center for International Studies will administer a program with the goal of providing opportunities to faculty for internationalization.

The programs will provide resources to (1) promote faculty participation in directing future student summer programs, (2) to encourage research in global issues in their respective disciplines, and (3) to provide international teaching opportunities and exchanges.

The Center for International Studies is pleased to announce the following program:

### **Summer Study Abroad Mentors Program**

- One faculty member from each college will be selected for the ASU sponsored Summer Study Abroad Mentors program each academic year. Eligible faculty must have been employed by ASU for a minimum of three years.
- The application requires a letter stating the faculty members' objectives for participation and how these will be used to enrich their current classes or develop a future study abroad program. Application letters should be sent to the appropriate department head and dean for approval and letters of recommendation. Faculty nominations from each college must be received by the Center for International Studies by the last day of the fall semester each academic year.
- Faculty members will select which summer program they wish to participate depending on the summer's approved programs.
- Faculty members will be awarded funds to cover the costs of a 7 day excursion to the program location. Awards will cover the costs of transportation, accommodations, and a per diem allowance per faculty member up to a maximum of \$3,000.00. It is the responsibility of the faculty member to secure any required travel documentation such as passports, visas, etc.
- Faculty members will meet with the on-site program directors and given an orientation in the specifics of administering a program in the chosen location, meet with host campus administrative staff, tour the program location(s), and meet with the student participants.
- Participating faculty members and mentors will submit a report/evaluation to the Center for International Studies by the first Friday of the fall semester and may be asked to meet with the International Education Committee to discuss the program at the fall meeting.
