Former SEC Commissioner Roel Campos is one of the country's leading experts in securities regulation, corporate governance, and board fiduciary duties. Mr. Campos was appointed by President Bush for two separate terms as a Commissioner of the SEC from 2002-2007. He earned wide respect for his balanced and thoughtful approach to public policy. Campos helped write and approved the current rules governing public company disclosure, operation of the public markets and corporate governance in America, including the SEC rules that implemented the Sarbanes Oxley Act. Mr. Campos was selected by the TRS Board as Fiduciary Counsel in July, 2008.



Ronnie Jung, TRS Executive Director

During Executive Director Ronnie Jung's thirteen years at TRS, he has served as the system's chief financial officer, deputy director, and interim executive director. Prior to joining TRS, Jung served as manager of performance audits for the Legislative Budget Board and in several positions with the Texas State Auditor's Office. He earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Texas and a master's degree in public affairs from the LBJ School of Public Affairs.
