Students at Angelo State University are *required* to take developmental mathematics courses if:

(1) their score is: less than 400 on the quantitative section of the SAT1,
less than 18* on the mathematics section of the ACT, or

(2) their score is: less than 230** on the mathematics section of the THEA,
less than 63 on the Elementary Algebra section of the ACCUPLACER.

- Students are not allowed to drop a developmental course unless they meet the minimum scores specified above for **both** the SAT1/ACT **and** the THEA (or ACCUPLACER). **Eligible students who wish to drop a developmental course must request a drop slip from their instructor and return it to the Registrar's Office.**
- Minimum SAT1/ACT scores do not apply if the student initially transfers 18 or more hours to ASU.
- A grade of C or better in developmental mathematics classes is required to fulfill developmental program requirements.
- Credit for developmental courses **cannot** be used to satisfy degree or graduation requirements.
- Grades in developmental classes **are** included in the computation of grade point averages (GPA).

Students Failing a TSI Assessment.

Students are no longer required to retest. Developmental requirements are satisfied upon successful completion of Math 130A and Math 130B.

Attendance Policy in Developmental Classes.

Students enrolled in developmental courses are expected to attend *all* class meetings. Class attendance is an important consideration in suspension decisions.

Preparing for College Level Mathematics.

Developmental mathematics courses are intended to prepare students for collegiate level mathematics. Students who fail to achieve the minimum scores on the ACT or SAT1 specified above will be required to complete *both* Math 130A and Math 130B with a grade of C or better in each – regardless of their score on the mathematics section of the THEA or other approved TSI assessment.

** less than 220 if taken prior to September 1, 1995
