Dear MSN Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in the Master of Science in Nursing Program. Admission and curriculum information is included in this packet. Classes in the graduate program are offered completely on-line through Blackboard, a course management system. Most online courses are asynchronous, or designed so that students can conveniently complete their work anywhere via internet access. Clinical requirements can be completed in the students' city of residence utilizing a preceptor and a local clinical facility if they meet course objectives.

The RN-MSN track is an accelerated mobility track which allows highly qualified Registered Nurses who are graduates of an accredited associate or diploma program, to pursue a Master of Science in Nursing without completing all baccalaureate degree nursing courses. Students in this track complete all required BSN academic courses (27 credits) and six prescribed BSN nursing courses (17 credits) in addition to required courses for the Master of Science in Nursing program. The MSN degree options include the Medical-Surgical Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS), the Family Nurse Practitioner option, and the Nurse Educator option. Credit hours for the graduate options vary from 34 to 47 credit hour requirement depending on selected option. There is a point at which a student enrolled in the RN-MSN track may decide to pursue the BSN degree only and would not lose any credits toward this degree. Students currently enrolled in an associate degree program who plan on applying for the RN-MSN track are strongly encouraged to contact the graduate advisor during the last year of their associate degree program.

Graduate education in nursing prepares nurses to assume leadership roles in nursing practice, education, and administration. The advanced practice nurse options of CNS and FNP provide clinical expertise, consultation, research, education and leadership. Whereas all advanced practice nurses share professional characteristics of graduate nursing preparation, roles differ in clinical application. The CNS provides direct patient care for a specialized client population, develops innovative therapeutic nursing interventions, provides education to both nurses and other health care workers, and develops and implements continuous quality assessment and improvement programs. The FNP provide direct care to families and individuals across the life span and interface with other provider team members to supply broad-based comprehensive healthcare.

The Nurse Educator option prepares graduates with advanced nursing knowledge with additional nursing education focus. Graduates are prepared to teach in a variety of nursing programs including vocational, associate, and baccalaureate.

Admission Requirements

Admission Requirements

- The student must apply and be accepted into the Graduate School. A separate application for the RN-MSN track must also be completed. This application is available on the departmental website or in the departmental office.
- An associate degree, or diploma, from a nursing program accredited by the National League for Nursing. Graduates from non-accredited institutions may request special consideration.
- Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Current licensure or eligibility for licensure as a registered professional nurse in the state where the clinical practicum requirements will be completed. Proof of current licensure must be demonstrated by the beginning of the fall term in which nursing courses will be taken.
- A basic statistics course (equivalent to 3.0 semester hours of credit), completed with a grade of “C” or higher within the last 5 years.
- A basic computer literacy course (equivalent to 3.0 semester credit hours), or demonstrated competency.
- Two professional references regarding aptitude for graduate study.
- One faculty reference regarding aptitude for accelerated RN-MSN track.
- Prior to taking first graduate level nursing course, student must have completed a minimum of 90 undergraduate hours.
- The number of openings in the RN-MSN track is limited. Graduate faculty will evaluate each application and admit the most qualified applicants until all positions are filled.
- Preferred Application Deadlines are: **July 1st for Fall** enrollment and **October 1st for Spring** enrollment.

Prior to first clinical course the following must be submitted:

- Evidence of meeting the state-mandated immunization regulations.
- Current CPR (professional level) certification.

Procedure for Admission

Admission to the Angelo State University Graduate School:

- Apply to the Graduate School at Angelo State University. The application is located online at: http://www.angelo.edu/dept/grad_school/application.html, and may be submitted electronically. The telephone number of the Graduate School Office is (325) 942-2169.
- Official transcripts from all colleges or universities attended (except Angelo State University) must be provided. To be considered official, the transcript must be mailed from the issuing university's registrar's office directly to the ASU Graduate School.
- An essay of 100-500 words which describes your educational plans, career objectives, commitment to your particular field of study, any research experience, your view of research and possible research interests, and personal goals. The essay may also address any of the following factors which are qualities that will be acknowledged in the admission process:
 - Socioeconomic history
 - Family background (including level of educational attainment)
 - Personal talents, leadership capabilities, community service)

The MSN Advisor will evaluate applications in conjunction with the graduate faculty. Applicants will receive written notice of the admission decision as soon as possible after it has been made. Applicants who are denied admission may appeal the decision through the Department of Nursing.
