MAJOR BRANT T. FRYAR

Major Brant T. Fryar is a Flight Commander in the Centurions Squadron at Squadron Officer School (SOS), Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. He is responsible for developing the professional military education of hundreds of students each year, to include Air Force captains, DOD civilians, and international officers. Major Fryar has also been on numerous SOS committees designed to maximize the effectiveness of the curriculum, schedule, and operational flow. Currently he serves as the vice on the Combat Leadership Exercise (CLX) committee.

Major Fryar was commissioned through the Air Force Reserve Officer's Training Corps (AFROTC) at Texas Tech University in 1995. He spent 10 years on active duty as a test manager and program manager in the acquisition career field (63A3) at various bases throughout the US (Brooks AFB, Kelly AFB, Los Angeles AFB, and Hanscom AFB). He also took a special duty assignment as a Flight Commander at the Academic Instructor School (AIS), Maxwell AFB. At AIS, Maj Fryar taught new Air Force instructors teaching skills to make them more effective in the classroom. In 2005 Major Fryar separated from Active Duty and went straight into the reserves. He came back to Maxwell AFB and has served as a Flight Commander at SOS through 2009. During that time span, he also pinned on Major, applied for Air Command and Staff College (ACSC) and was promptly picked up to attend in residence. Upon graduating from ACSC in June 2008, Maj Fryar returned to SOS where he has continued to sharpen the leadership and officership skills of Air Force captains.
