Research Agenda

Exploring the nexus of prisons and society. Criminal Justice Education is also a research area of interest. I am very interested in the literature relating to efficaciousness of facilitating active learning for our students in the Criminal Justice field and I would like to be able to contribute to this field by developing, testing and documenting activities and practices specific to university level (undergraduate and graduate, online) Criminal Justice learning. Also, in the research pipeline are current and future projects relating to criminal justice personnel and the effects of violence within their occupations and a study of anticipatory socialization of criminal justice majors strongly aspiring to a career in law enforcement. A manuscript on cross-gender training

in maximum security institutions is underway and a co-authored manuscript on the organization and inter-relationships of U.S. federal law enforcement agencies is in development.
