

Over the summer, several important initiatives related to planning and the growth of ASU have been moving forward.

Planning Progress

- The Academic Master Plan is in final draft form and undergoing final review. It will be presented to campus in early fall.
- Meanwhile, the Texas Tech University System Board of Regents will be reviewing a revised draft of a System-wide plan at its August 6-7 meeting.
- To tie everything together, the Strategic Planning Council is holding its summer retreat August 4 to complete the development of the overall Vision 2012 Strategic Plan. The Vision 2012 Plan, which places the Academic Master Plan as its core, will be revealed to the campus in early fall after the approved version of the TTUS Strategic Plan has been reviewed and incorporated locally.

Additionally, the Environmental Scanning Committee has begun its work, collecting information on developments in each of twelve different areas of concern to ASU. Their work will be very important in the resource prioritization process, as we move toward a comprehensive process of aligning resources with institutional initiatives and environmental realities.

"Framework for Future Growth"

In order to plan for the future growth of ASU, the organizational chart has been redesigned to create strategic realignments of existing functions and to incorporate new initiatives. A version of the new organizational chart will go into effect July 1, 2010, after we have hired two new vice presidents (Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs; Vice President for Student Affairs and Enrollment Management). This conceptual organizational chart provides candidates with insight into the organizational directions being taken by ASU and will allow input from the successful candidates prior to full implementation.

A goal of this conceptual organizational chart is to identify "locus of responsibility" for several major functions. As a result, the chart is a combination of line authority, positions, and functional areas (denoted by the hexagons).
