**DETAILS FOR GROUPS' REPORTS**

**Product: A set of recommendations, not to exceed three (3) pages in length, addressing the following components:**

- 1) Definition and parameters of paper (“We are addressing xxxx, defined at ASU to mean xxxx”). You will need to establish your own definition, based on your conversations within and beyond your group.
- 2) Short literature review (very brief, to provide a context for the recommendations that follow).
- 3) Recommendations, as many as you wish, listed in order of priority.
  - a) State the recommendation (e.g., “Expand the advising function of the Center for Academic Excellence.”).
  - b) Provide justification for your recommendation (e.g., local tissues/concerns, results of previous assessments, national trends). Be sure to emphasize why the recommendation is particularly relevant to the creation of a residential campus.
  - c) Indicate potential costs by topic/area (facilities expansion, staffing). Don’t worry about trying to estimate actual costs; that’s not within the purview of our committee.

To complete your report, feel free to collaborate with other offices, individuals, and groups to gather information in order to make your recommendations as comprehensive as possible.

**DUE DATE:** Wednesday, April 29, to Jim Limbaugh via electronic format. All the reports will then either be sent out via email attachments or posted to the Strategy/Planning/Policy website for everyone to read .

**NEXT STEPS:** During the week of May 4, we’ll convene to review each of the recommendations, discuss connections and themes, and identify overall priorities (e.g., answering some of the “big picture” issues like Carnegie classification, definition, desired/optimum for campus occupancy as a portion of total enrollment). Jim Limbaugh will create an overall report by May 15 and distribute it for final review. After revisions have been made, the report will be submitted to Dr. Rallo by our June 1 deadline.
