Course Description and Learning Outcomes:

English 1302 helps ASU students develop skills required to accomplish effective academic writing in various disciplines. The writing tasks in the university curriculum share three main objectives: 1) responding to texts, 2) using information, and 3) constructing arguments. This course will enable students to accomplish these objectives more effectively by concentrating on summarizing, paraphrasing, critiquing, and synthesizing. Writing assignments take students methodically through these skills, beginning with a critique and ending with an argumentative research paper, as each assignment builds on the skills developed in preceding assignments.

Requirements and Grading:

The course work includes a 4-page essay, a 2-page research proposal, a 10-source annotated bibliography, and a 7-page research paper class discussion. *Each student is required to turn in all written assignments to be considered for a passing grade*. The final course grade is calculated this way:

Explanatory paper	20%
Research proposal	15%
Annotated bibliography	20%
Research paper	35%
Class participation, blogs	10%

Policies for Assignments: Assignments are to be submitted via email as Word documents (linda.kornasky@angelo.edu), and they are due by midnight on the days assigned below. Important warning: if you use Google Docs to write a paper, be sure to send me a downloaded copy of the document rather than sending me a Google docs link. (When you save the document, go to the file menu in the top left corner of the screen, hover the mouse over the download option, and then save the document as either a PDF or a Word document.) The grades of unexcused late assignments are penalized 10 points (one letter grade) per day.

<u>Blog Fridays</u>: We do not meet in the classroom on certain Fridays, marked below on the schedule. There are three exceptions: the first two Fridays of the semester (January 21 and 28), the Friday of the last week of class (May 6). On the other Fridays, we will participate online in a blog during our fifty-minute class time: 10:00-10:50 or 11:00-11:50 a.m., depending on your section. For these assignments, please log on to our course blog to publish a comment and a reply to classmates' comments. (The links are embedded in the schedule below).

<u>Attendance</u>: Students should not have more than three unexcused absences, but no penalties for additional absences will be given this semester because of the Covid pandemic.

Absences for Observance of Religious Holy Day: Students who intend to be absent from class to observe a religious holy day (as defined in ASU O.P. 10.19) must inform the professor in writing prior to the absence and make up any scheduled assignments within an appropriate timeframe determined by the professor.
