# **Course Description**

This **11-week self-study** program is designed to prepare you to pass the TSI or take a T-section math class.

### **Prerequisite and Co-requisite Courses**

Ability to login to Blackboard.

# **Course Delivery**

This is a face-to-face course with online components that students are expected to access in Blackboard.1

#### **Required Texts and Materials**

A spiral notebook for working problems and taking notes is strongly recommended. All course material will be posted in Blackboard.

#### **Technology Requirements**

You must have access to a computer that has internet access. Calculators are not allowed for this course.

#### **Communication**

Faculty will respond to email and/or telephone messages within 24 hours during working hours Monday through Friday. Weekend messages may not be returned until Monday.

Written communication via email: All private communication will be done exclusively through your ASU email address. Check frequently for announcements and policy changes. In your emails to faculty, include the course name and section number in your subject line.

# Grading

#### **Evaluation and Grades**

You will receive an 'S' for satisfactory or a 'U' for unsatisfactory in this class.

#### **Grading System grading**

If the overall course grade is 80% or higher, you will have successfully completed this course. This course does NOT give you a TSI complete status.

### **Assignment and Activity Descriptions**

This course contains 6 modules. For each module you will take a pretest to determine your knowledge level of the topic. Then you will be given assignments over the topics in that module. If you do well on a certain topic you may be exempt from one or more assignments. Within each section there are videos that need to be viewed before starting the assignment. A textbook excerpt is also provided in each section. When you have completed all the assignments you will do a module review. You must receive at least an 80 to go to the posttest. Once you have completed the module the next one will appear. A 60% or higher must be obtained on each posttest to move on to the next module. To receive a grade of S satisfactory you must complete all 6 modules.
