Learning Outcomes:

- 1) Understand impacts and contributions of livestock on human population
 - 2) Livestock breeds and the importance of each species
 - 3) Production and husbandry practices relative to each species.
- These learning outcomes will be evaluated through exams and quizzes.

Attendance: Each student has the opportunity to earn credit for attending class in the form of pop quizzes. These quizzes will be given at the instructor's discretion in lecture. If there is a circumstance where a student must miss class, they should inform me as soon as possible in order to accommodate that student accordingly. If a student anticipates missing class for other school activities, exams and quizzes may be taken prior to missing the exam or quiz date. Missing exams or quizzes due to illness will be taken into consideration with a doctor's note.

Lecture: It is the student's responsibility to attend lecture and lab and come prepared to learn. Notes are NOT provided (some diagrams and pictures will be distributed).

Laboratory: Lab will meet each week at either the MIR or in the Vincent building. Occasionally lab will meet outside of the ASU campus; location of labs will be announced in class and/or via email prior to the lab. Students are responsible for checking email for any last minute changes. While attendance is not required, there will be a midterm and lab final to test knowledge gained in lab. A 3 minute presentation over livestock equipment will be required by each student. Equipment will be randomly assigned to students. A rubric for the presentation will be provided to students. There will be lab quizzes made available on Mondays via Blackboard. These must be printed, completed and turned into the appropriate folder outside my office by Friday at 5:00 PM on the week assigned. *Typed quizzes will not be graded.*

Classroom Etiquette: Treat others as you would like to be treated. I expect students to offer me as much attention during class as I offer them. Cell phone usage should be minimal and hats

and caps should be taken off in the classroom (both ladies and gentlemen). Excessive use of cell phones and disrespect to classmates will result in the student being asked to leave the classroom. *Students that show up after the first exam or quiz has been handed out will NOT be allowed to take that exam or quiz for credit in the course.*
