Course Description

Vectors, Newtonian mechanics, non-inertial reference frames, central forces, systems of particles, Lagrangian mechanics, and oscillating systems.

Prerequisite and Co-requisite Courses

Physics 2326/2126, and credit for or parallel registration in Physics 3301.

Prerequisite Skills

Ability to use a scientific calculator and ability to use a printed integral table.

- gain factual knowledge in physics,
- learned fundamental principles of physics, and
- apply course material to problem solving.

Course Delivery

This is a face-to-face course with online components that students are expected to access in Blackboard.¹
