Course Objective

This class is designed to introduce students to the classification, distribution, production, and utilization of forage as related to wildlife and livestock production systems. Specifically, we will address vegetation types, climatic regions, plant morpho-physiology, forage quality and evaluation, improving forage production, and forage-induced disorders.

After successful completion of the course, students should be able to:

- (1) Identify forage-induced disorders in livestock,
- (2) Describe how plant susceptibility to grazing changes throughout the year, and
- (3) Develop management recommendations for supplementation.

Text and Readings

The required text for this class is the latest edition of *Forages Vol. I: An Introduction to Grassland Agriculture* by Barnes et al. We will be reading and discussing several chapters out of the text. Students will be expected to read assigned readings before the next class meeting and answer questions on line regarding the chapter. In lecture, we will discuss the reading, review the lecture notes, and discuss other relevant information.

I have developed a set of notes for this class. These will be provided on Blackboard. Prior to beginning a new section in the course, each student should download the lectures notes and bring a printed or electronic copy to lecture. The notes are written in outline form with space provided for you to take additional notes if needed. I do this because I believe the most efficient way for students to learn is through participation. It is very difficult to participate in class discussions or to raise questions if you are writing down every-other-statement made by the instructor. By providing notes, each student will be free to listen, think, and add to

discussions in class.

Course Delivery

Please note that even through some of the essential information and assignments will be available on line, **this is not an on-line course.** All students are expected to attend lectures on both Tuesday and Thursday morning. Weekly discussions, lectures, and ancillary information will be covered in lecture to supplement the information on line.
