Course Description

This course is an introduction to the field of psychology. You will be challenged to think critically about many topics important to human behavior. Our approach will be to integrate social/cultural, neural/biological, environmental, and social/cultural influences in the final analysis of cognition and behavior.

Student Learning Outcomes

1) Understand basic psychological principles. 2) Be able to think critically about human behavior and causes of behavior. 3) Be familiar with various subfields of psychology. 4) Be able to understand how psychologists collect data and 5) apply the data/research to everyday life.

Course Delivery

This is an online course with learning resources and supplemental materials posted in Blackboard.

Course Requirements

Exams: There will be 2 exams. The exams will generally be composed of multiple choice, true/false, and short answer items.
