### **Courses Written/Modified**

BOR 3340 Legal Issues in International Relations  
 Rewrote class to include textbook *The Patriot Act: Issues and Consequences* by Cary Stacy Smith and Li-Ching Hung (Charles C. Thomas, Publisher, 2010). Takes the student deeper into the USA PATRIOT Act and explains the impact on civil liberties diminished by the legislation. Added the USA FREEDOM Act as it modified the USA PATRIOT Act. Aligns the course intention with a more appropriate text that reflects the intentions of the course as designed and described in the current Angelo State University Catalog.
