Future Research Agenda

The nexus of prisons and society captivates me. Criminal Justice Education also constitutes a research area of interest to follow in the near future. I am very interested in the literature relating to efficaciousness of facilitating active learning for our students in the Criminal Justice field and I would like to be able to contribute to this field by developing, testing and documenting activities and practices specific to university level (undergraduate and graduate, online) Criminal Justice learning. This topic was nascently addressed in a recent roundtable discussion at the A.C.J.S. annual conference. Effects of the occupational hazard of witnessing violence on criminal justice personnel constitutes a pipeline project along with the study of anticipatory socialization of criminal justice majors strongly aspiring to a career in law enforcement. A manuscript on cross-gender training, especially in maximum-security institutions is underway, along with a grounded-theory methodology analysis of the writings and self-imposed duties of the early Boston Prison Discipline Society.
