## **Graduate Practicum (Psy 6371 & 6671)**

### **Supervision of Interns (1982-2011)**

- Placed interns in the practicum sites and met with them once a week or more as needed.
- Visited sites as needed, monitored interns' progress by reviewing their daily logs, had them make three presentations (case, agency, and ethics topic) to the practicum class, and evaluated their performance for 9 credit hours (450 clock hours).

## **Counseling Service-Station (2009-2011)**

In fall 2009, I established a Counseling Service-Station where some of my interns under my supervision provided counseling to ASU students for smoking cessation, stress management, test anxiety, weight reduction, and interpersonal relations. This was my initiative and self-assigned overload to help interns

because the number of sites had decreased due to closing of some sites. There was no directive or suggestion from the administration for me to take on this assignment.
