Major Spill: Implement emergency evacuation, contain spill, and notify University Police at 942-2071	Incidental Spill: Clean up spill and report incident to Environmental Health & Safety at 942-2180
 Major Spill Notify University Police at 942-2071 and provide: Type of spill (chemical, biological, or radioactive) Substance name, quantity, & type (liquid or solid) Specific location of the spill (facility/room) Hazards associated with the substance Exposure/injuries and medical treatment needed Alert individuals in close proximity of the spill. Evacuate area and facility if substance poses an inhalation or other exposure hazard. Create barrier to spill area and post warning signs. 	 Decontamination Eye Contact: Flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Call 9-1-1 for medical treatment. Skin Contact: Flush skin with soap and water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. Call 9-1-1 for medical treatment. Inhalation: Evacuate victim to fresh air immediately. Call 9-1-1 if breathing is difficult. Ingestion: Aspiration hazard. If swallowed, DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING. Call Poison Control Center at 1-800-222-1222.
 Incidental Spill Create barrier to spill area and post warning signs. Neutralize and clean up spill to the extent you've been trained/are comfortable, following SDS instructions. Use appropriate PPE; gloves, eye protection, etc Use appropriate absorbent/containment materials If you are not trained/comfortable; contain the spill, secure the area, and wait on appropriate personnel. 	 Emergency Evacuation Close all hazardous material containers. Turn off flames and other ignition sources. Close sashes and leave fume hoods ON Turn off electrical equipment/heating devices. Create barrier to spill area and post warning signs. Assist others with decontamination/provide first aid. Account for all personnel in the spill area.
